Polo Package at The Brazilian Court



While the village of Wellington, Florida, is ground zero for winter polo and most other equestrian sports, nearby Palm Beach is the capital of high society, and its historic [Brazilian Court](#) hotel (now [sporting a new face-lift in its guest rooms](#)) can be your base when you travel for the sport of kings this winter. A three-night polo-themed package starting at \$2,167 immerses you in chukkers and mallets with a two-hour introductory lesson at the International Polo Club Palm Beach in Wellington, as well as tickets to attend Sunday Brunch and a polo match at The Pavillion in the club. While there is no polo at The Brazilian Court itself, you can practice your hand-eye coordination skills with a croquet set and wooden horses. *Through April 30*
